SILENT KEY REPORT—Obituary from the 'Grants Pass Daily'-- Forest Gene White
Forest Gene White, 77, of Grants Pass died Monday, Sept. 8, 2008, at his home. A memorial service will be held at 3 p.m. Sunday at First Christian Church, with Wes Winn, pastor, officiating. H St., Grants Pass, OR 97526. He was born April 22, 1931, in Versailles, Mo., to Forest Ernest and Gladys Louise White. His family moved to Parkdale in 1944 and he graduated from Eugene High School in 1949. He worked in Eugene and Salem as an automotive service manager

for Kendall Ford. In 1950, he married his wife, Tish, who survives. They moved their family to Grants Pass in 1963 and opened Gene's Union Service and bought out Wimer's Battery & Electric in 1965. He became the Josephine County fleet maintenance manager in 1972 and retired in 1993. He was a member of the Rogue River Accordion Club and entertained weekly at local nursing homes. He also was a member of the Order of the Arrow. For 43 years, he was a ham radio operator, and was involved locally to globally with SOARC, ORARES, MARS and ARRL. He was instrumental in getting Gov. Tom McCall to declare the first Ham Radio Operator's Day and in building the first emergency services vehicle for Josephine County. He was a founding member of the Josephine County Sportsman Association and the Rogue Valley Bow Hunters. For many years, he played violin with the Rogue Valley Orchestra and he gave violin and accordion lessons and repaired instruments. He was a member of Karen's Kitchen Koffee Klatch and a lifetime member of First Christian Church. In addition to his wife, survivors include a daughter, Debbi White (Ayriss-Lard) of Bend; a son, Kyle White of Talent; three sisters, Leta Rath of San Rafael, Calif., Joy Krumdieck of Tumalo, and Marjorie White of Eugene; six grandchildren and four great-grandsons. (Thi information was sent to us by Dick, K7DDI, and came from Gene's local paper.)---Gene's call was K7YQM. He was known as "Gene" on the air. Gene was often heard checking into the net, and he will be missed. Gene became a member of the O.E.N. in 1956, and held O.E.N. certificate no. 525.



3 JUST GOOD CHOW By Connie, N7RBH----HERBED SMALL NEW RED POTATOES---Preparation time, ten minutes. Cooking time, twenty minutes. Serves four: Ingredients—1 or 2 small potatoes----4 teaspoons of butter 4 teaspoons minced fresh parsley. - Or 1 1/3 teaspoons dried parsley. 4 teaspoons minced fresh chives, or 1 1/3 teaspoons of dried chives Two small green onions. Fresh parsley sprigs is optional. (1) Peal ½ inch strip around the center of each potato. Place potatoes in medium sauce pan of cold water. (2) Add enough water to cover the potatoes, bring to boil over using medium heat. Boil until potatoes are firm. After about 20 minutes, drain water off the potatoes. Do not over cook. Cover to keep warm. (3) Place in a microwave safe dish. Add the butter, melt for five to ten seconds. Stir in onions, parsley, chives. Pour over potatoes. Toss to coat potatoes. Spoon potatoes into a serving bowel. Variations; sprinkle with cooked beacon, green onions.


