2 THOUGHTS FROM VERN, K6UGS, ON REPEATER ENCODING

A little tidbit of info for you regarding the use of tones to get into repeaters. In most cases tone activation is needed because the repeater may be in an area which has a lot of noise coming through the receiver. That noise will sometimes activate the repeater, then who wants to listen to a bunch of garbage. By installing a tone, the noise is eliminated. Make sense?

As for the other tones, yes they are designed to perform other functions on the repeater. They are a horse of a different color.

THOUGHTS ON TWO METER REPEATERS (TNX TO Colonel Phil Rand, W7BW for sharing)

“ Two meters has never attracted me and I have seldom used the band. I will admit to having 2 meter radios, but in the past just for emergency communications. Especially when I lived in Rocky Point and made the 70 mile round trip every day. We had wonderful folks like Dick Suber who would gladly drive out and help with any problem. Now with cell phones, who needs 2 meters?? Oh I do understand power outages, etc, but the repeaters would go off line too.” Phil goes on to say “ We do need the Dennies and the Dicks!! “

(ed's note: Phil drove the mentioned seventy miles every day to work and back from Rocky Point to Klamath Falls, where he worked as our airport manager for many years. Dennie Dunkeson, WA7YPR, and Dick Suber, K7DDI, mentioned above, have been knights in shining armor, as far as serving the amateur radio community in Klamath County. Both have spent many hours keeping local repeaters up and running. I can remember many times in the past when DDI has went out to help someone in trouble. If you needed help, Dick was always monitoring the 146.85 repeater. He was there to help if he could. Like Phil points out, we need the Dennies and Dicks of this world in amateur radio; we could not do with out them. Dennie has worked tirelessly for the amateur radio community over the years. As Phil says, with cell phones, two meters is not as important as it once was as a means of emergency communication.

ARE TWO-METER REPEATERS ABOUT TO FADE OUT??

On January 12, your editor attended the annual repeater association meeting for the group that represents Klamath County. The group charges its members a fee of five dollars a year, and that includes family members, but only one vote is allowed for each membership. The financial secretary reported that the group has 27 paid up members, and there was a hope that some others that had not paid their dues yet would do that. I figured up what 27 members at 5 dollars a year would bring in, that being one hundred and thirty five dollars. ----- This group has three two meter machines, one 440 machine, and some packet gear. It also owns an emergency two meter repeater, which can be set up anywhere. They own other items, and some spare parts for the existing repeaters. It is more than solvent, because of good stewardship of the money.brought in over a long period of years. -----There was much discussion about one of the two meter repeaters, it may need up to 3176 dollars to put it in good shape. With 27 dues paying members, that would come to 117.63 for each member. The group has the money to do the job, but with so few members, it would take a long time to replace what was spent with dues at 5 dollars a year. It was decided to leave the repeater needing all that work like it is now, as long as it is running. -- ----- There are many hundreds of amateur radio operators in Klamath County, but it appears that there are very few who have any interest in keeping the repeaters going, Over time, the expenses of keeping up just a couple of repeaters will take away the money that the group has, and with only 27 putting money back in, it would appear that one day there may no longer be a repeater association in Klamath County, unless the ham community gets its act together and supports the group.----- The three two meter repeaters are all mostly quiet these days. I have listened to the 443.9 machine, I hear some activity on it. ----. I am wondering if repeater groups in other locations are having the same kind of experience we are having in Klamath County, lots of repeaters to keep up and only a hand full of folks that are paying the bill and do the work needed to keep it going? --- Jan. 26 up date: I counted the check-ins on the 146.85 Klamath County net tonight, and it would appear to me that there are about 47 dues paying members, that is a lot better that the 27 reported as paid up members earlier in the year. Things Getting Out of Hand: (on the net) by Warren N7IPG

Several things have gotten to the point that they are out of hand for the net operation.

Early Check-ins. It is not the responsibility of someone other than the evenings net control to check you into the net. It is totally up to the individual net controls whether they want to take early check-in on any given night or not. If you need an early check in and the net control hasn't taken early check-ins prior to the start of net, it is better if you check in when emergency gear is called instead of interrupting the net and asking for an early check-in. You should also give some thought as to the reason you need an early check-in. If you have to be at a club meeting or have company, that is one thing. But there are too many people checking in and out every single night, mainly for dinner, and this adds nothing to the net. If you are not going to participate in the net operation, why bother to check-in in the first place. Dinner times can be adjusted or you can check into a later net. Also, please don't check in and then turn your radio off, or leave without notifying the net control. This happens way too often and valuable net time is wasted if someone wants you later and you are not there.

Tuning up. It appears that the net frequency has become the international tune up frequency. Granted a lot of carrier's and tuning up on frequency during the net is nothing more than someone causing malicious interference. Therefore, net controls and others should not acknowledge this interference. The people causing it will go away when they get the idea that they aren't bothering the net. If you're one of the people that is tuning up on the frequency unintentionally to get your antenna tuned, please don't. Older tube type rigs can pretty much go anywhere on the band without the swr getting too high at the band edges. The new radios don't have that much leeway and the antenna must be re-adjusted if you move very far from where you had it adjusted in the first place. Therefore if you have to re-adjust please do it at least 5kc from the net frequency and then move to the net frequency. If this little movement causes your swr to climb above acceptable limits, you better be checking your antenna system and/tuner to find out what is wrong and get it corrected.


